

Resolution No. 2020-13

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF CLARKSVILLE, TEXAS SUPPORTING A FEDERAL LEGAL HOLIDAY FOR NATIVE AMERICAN INDIANS.

WHEREAS, The City of Clarksville, Texas Mayor and Council is comprised of nine members of a municipality located in Clarksville, Texas; and

WHEREAS, the Council recognized special memorials, historic events, historical figures and national activities that are consequential to the development of the United States of America; and

WHEREAS, Native Americans have contributed to historic and cultural events and have contributed to the history and formation of the United States of America; and

WHEREAS, the City of Clarksville supports and promotes a recommendation to the United States of America to designate one day each year as a legal holiday for the Native American Indian.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLARKSVILLE, TEXAS THAT:

Section 1. The City of Clarksville Council hereby expresses its sincere support for the endeavor of Mr. Merle Whiteside to present a petition to the United States government enacting a legal holiday for the Native American Indians.


Section 2. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passing.
