**Effective Thursday, January 07, 2021, 12:00 noon**, City of Clarksville offices will be temporarily closed to the public. These measures are put in place in an effort to protect the public, City employees and their families from the novel coronavirus and to ensure continued provision of essential City services. The City will remain staffed to provide essential services such as police, fire, public works, code enforcement, water utilities and administrative staff. We are experiencing a high rise in COVID-19 cases. **As mandated by the Governor, face coverings are now mandatory.** Face coverings apply when entering City Hall, Fire Department, Police Department and other city facilities. We will continue to stay abreast of the number of active COVID-19 cases in the County and the availability of vaccine.
