MEET US ON THE CLARKSVILLE SQUARE!!!

The City of Clarksville sees a need to host two city wide clean-ups a year in an effort to provide a clean environment for our residents, entice industry and business and promote and grow the city. The 1st event will be held Saturday, May 1, at 7:00 am. If you are physically unable or have no means of transportation to get your items to the convenient station/city barn, Hwy 37 South, then you may place discarded items on the curb side and those items will be picked up. You may call City Hall, 903-427-3834 extension 253 and leave your name and address. Curbside pickup in Clarksville is for residential customers only. City Barn will be open all day to accommodate our citizens so feel free to take your discarded items to the city barn convenient station from 7:00 am until 5:00 pm.

The following items will NOT be accepted or picked-up by Sanitation Solution on the day of the pick up. The same applies to the convenient station.

Batteries

Shingles

Unemptied Paint Cans

Hazardous Materials

Appliances that are not tagged

Limbs and brush

Tires

There will also be a tire drive hosted by Red River County. You may bring your tires to Patman Drive (Pacific Columns location) FREE of charge starting at 9:00 am., May 1st. We will take them until the trailer is full or we close. Whichever comes first. Passenger tires only!!! This is for residents of Clarksville /Red River County only. No commercial businesses may bring tires.

The city is asking that those with trucks and trailers that are able to assist with the loading and hauling of discarded items or that can pick up litter, to meet on the Clarksville Square at 7:00 a.m. on Saturday morning of May 1st.

We are asking for those that can assist with the picking up of trash and litter or cleaning of curbs, to please bring your tools and be a part. Trash bags and plastic gloves will be provided. For those that can not attend that morning, please help your neighbor and assist by cleaning a street at your own leisure.

As a community, it is our responsibility to assist by whatever means we can, to ensure we live in a clean, healthy and safe environment. We all need to do our part.

The City is asking for your help. There are numerous areas that need to be addressed. The litter problem is real here.
